Region III virtual Fall meeting

The Region III fall meeting was held virtually as a Zoom conference on October 9 & 10. The 5 diocese each gave reports; Buffalo, Rochester, Pittsburgh, Altona-Johnstown and Youngstown. Erie PA was also represented.

Nadia Lopez, National English Coordinator, attended. She supports virtual events like Ultreya for those who are homebound or uncomfortable in public. She also requested using Amazon smile and designating Cursillo National as your charity. Last month Cursillo received \$280 in contributions.

Altona - Johnstown and Rochester both reported that their study of the Step by Step Rectors Guide is complete and will be implemented in the next men's and women's weekends.

The focus of the Saturday session was Ultreya. Some notable points from my notes:

Bobbie LaVoie "What Ultreya is and what it is not"

- Ultreya was created to encourage one another to share their experiences i.e. "experience-based communication".
- Group reunion 3-6 people. Men with men, women with women. Try to group with different people each week.
- Witness speaker should share with Spiritual Advisor and those asked to give Echo beforehand.
- Should end in prayer for community, personal petitions, & praise. Pray the Our Father.
- Snacks or meals are ok but not required.
- Sponsors and team leaders should be regular attendees of Ultreya.
- The true benefit of Ultreya is afterwards when we go out and live the experiences learned.

Regarding Group Reunion when sharing our Piety, Study and Action:

- Piety is not our ritual or what we do (mass, rosary, novena, etc.) but "how am I growing in my relationship with God?"
- Study – Don't simply say what you read or watched or heard, but share what it was and what you learned from it.

Julie Fleckenstein "How to give an Echo"

- The main purpose and characteristic of an echo should be a summation of the witness recounting all the pertinent points and events.
- An echo may include some shared similar experiences, devotions or thoughts by the person giving the echo.

Spiritual Director's Reflection:

My brothers and sisters in Christ, given the current challenges that we are experiencing in our lives, it is easy to get our attention distracted from our personal relationship with Christ. Eduardo Bonin, our founder, says:

"...the evil of the world is the evil of the human person, and what the person needs most is to encounter himself and then to be able to grasp with joy, and even perplexity, the invitation that Christ gives to him, so that by being connected to Him by Grace, and through that same Grace, he will understand the joy that comes from spreading it to others."

When we live the Cursillo weekend, we are given the tools needed to encounter ourselves, so that we can, through grace, accept His invitation. On the spiritual side, these tools come in the form of meditations, starting with the "Know yourself" one, on the very evening the candidates arrive.

So, I believe it would be beneficial to recall in our spiritual life that first meditation to strengthen our relationship with our beloved Jesus. Knowing ourselves, very often, is more challenging than what it seems. Our lives are constantly bombarded with all kinds of worldly messages that bring us stress and disorganization.

Our meditation is centered on the discourse of the birds of the air and the lilies of the field (Mt 6:26-34). It reminds us of the Father's love and of the uselessness of worrying for our own wellbeing. And why is this? It is because when we place our mind and soul in the procurement of what we believe is indispensable, we cloud our ability to know who we are, to recognize ourselves as sons and daughters of God. The essence of this gospel passage is in verse 33:

"But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

Do I worry about what I am going to eat or drink or wear? Do I worry about feel-good things or activities? Do I worry about music or entertainment or popularity? Our Lord does not say that we do not need all these things.

He says that if we first seek the Kingdom of God, then all these things will be added.

Let us meditate on these things, let us remove the worrying and the stress so that we can see who we really are and open ourselves to God's grace to let Him transform our lives.

And always remember, "Christ is counting on you!"

And now let us pray for the beatification of our founder,

O God, dispenser of all graces and charisms. You granted your servant EDUARDO BONNIN AGUILO the grace of dedicating his whole life, with humility and generosity, to the work of the CURSILLOS IN CHRISTIANITY MOVEMENT, as he traveled the five continents proclaiming that God in Christ loves us.

Grant us through his intercession the favor that we now implore Thee. (name the favor being requested)

Also grant us the grace, of his beatification for your greater glory and the good of your Church, that shines throughout the lives of its saints.

We beg this of You in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
