Buffalo Cursillo History #12 (continued):

December 2022 “Renumbering Cursillo Weekends”

1973 was a year of new beginnings. From 1965 to December 1972, there had been Men’s Cursillos #1 to #29 and Women’s Cursillos #1 to #20. Beginning in January 1973, Cursillos would be numbered consecutively beginning with Women’s #50. This helped to end the confusion of the members of the Men’s and Women’s Cursillos.

In addition to the above change, Buffalo Cursillo found a new home, created a new newsletter, added Secretariat members and held two Reunion Masses each month.

The new home for Buffalo Cursillo was found at Bishop Gibbons High School in North Tonawanda. Built in 1961, the co-ed high school remained open for ten years, staffed by the Felician Sisters and the Barnabite Priests.

The high school had been built in honor of Edmund Francis Gibbons, who served as a priest for the diocese of Buffalo from 1893 to 1919. Gibbons was appointed sixth Bishop of Albany from 1919 to 1954. He was still living at the time when Bishop Gibbons High School was built and later died at the age of 95 in 1964.

Fr. Charles Schoy, founding Principal and diocesan priest, remained in charge of the buildings after the school closed in 1971. The diocese allowed various groups including SEARCH, a Cursillo – styled weekend retreat for teens as well as other high school retreats the use of the building.

Buffalo Cursillo had the use of the main building where Men’s Cursillo #29 - #87 were held until 1979. In the meantime, Bishop Head had put the high school on the real estate market around 1974. Over time, several buildings were sold, and Bishop Gibbons remained Cursillo’s home until 1979.

A new format for the “Buffalo Cursillo Newsletter” was created. No longer was the newsletter mimeographed on yellow paper by the Secretary Agnes Johnson (Women’s #1) in a borrowed office. Tom Bennett (Men’s #24) introduced a new photo offset edition which was mailed through the US Postal Service with a non-profit permit. Much preparation for the newsletter was done in the new Cursillo Office at Bishop Gibbons. This included help in writing, editing, photographing, typing. Addressing, sorting and mailing. This necessitated an addition to the Secretariat – the Communications Section headed by Bill Hausle (Men’s #11). Other additions included the Liturgy Section, separate Cursillo Sections: Women’s Cursillo Section chaired by Mary Ann Ericson (Women’s #7) and Men’s Cursillo Section headed by Frank Krahling (Men’s #15). Under this section, additional men were charged with Team Training, Commissary (Kitchen), Maintenance, Setup and Cleanup, Purchasing and Inventory, Ushers, Parking and Security. With fourteen Cursillo’s planned for 1973, think of the large numbers people attending the holy Hour, Las Mananitas and Closings.

Post Cursillo was divided into the Northern Division with six Northern Ultreyas chaired by Jim Powers (Men’s #13) and the Southern Division with six Ultreyas South and East of Rt. 5 chaired by Jack Breen (Men’s #12).

It became apparent that two Diocesan Reunion Masses should be held on each second Friday of the month, one in the Northtowns and one in the Southtowns. For some time, the Diocesan Reunion Masses had been approaching the capacity of the churches, the parking lots and the halls for the socials.

The spirit of the congregation in praising God was a joy to behold and a joy to be a part of. This was evidenced by the number of Cursillistas who attend month after month and of those who attended the Diocesan Reunion Mass even before they had made Cursillo.

1973 proved to be an extraordinary year: hosting 14 Cursillos, welcoming 462 Babe Chicks, boasting numerous volunteers in many facets of the Movement, and counting 12 thriving Ultreyas all set against the cultural backdrop of stay-at-home Moms, 3 major TV channels and the continuing war in Viet Nam.
