Spiritual Advisor Report:

BUFFALO CURSILLO HISTORY
HISTORIAN'S REPORT #43-SEPTEMBER, 2026
"FINANCIAL STEWARDS" PART I

Among the unsung heroes of the Buffalo Cursillo Movement were the Treasurers of the Secretariat. They were overlooked, especially in the early days, because the office of Treasurer was never included when the new roster of the Secretariat was listed in the Secretariat Minutes or in the monthly newsletter.

For the first twelve years from 1965-1977, there were only 3 Treasurers. (The terms of the length of the Secretariat office holders were not enshrined until the mid-1970s.) The first Treasurer was Michael Ventura (M #1) 1965-1969. Paul Needham (M #9) took over in late 1969 and continued to steer the financial ship of the Buffalo Cursillo until 1974 when Jim Honer (M #10) assumed the wheel until 1977.

It was only when the Treasurer sent out an SOS to the Cursillo community through the newsletter for much-needed funds that his name was ever mentioned, and usually as author of the article. Sometimes the Lay Director wrote a similar article out of financial necessity. Up until the fiscal year 1970, the Treasurer's Annual Report was simply printed in the newsletter.

While the early weekends usually cost about \$500 to put on, the free-will white envelope from each babe chick averaged about \$14 (some giving as little as \$10) and as high as \$50). Up until 1970, income included \$3588 annually from the Diocese of Buffalo, money from book sales, Days of Renewal, Leaders' School, Workshops, collections from the Diocesan Reunion Masses and miscellaneous contributions.

Expenses included the purchase of some food and kitchen supplies for the Weekend, Liturgy supplies, Mission crosses, Cursillo books, photographs, paper supplies, postage for the Office and newsletters, honorarium for priests, National and Regional dues, payment for use of the facility to hold each Cursillo and Leaders' School and purchases for any new equipment. Expenses were generally about \$12,000-\$13,000 per year.

By 1972, the Buffalo Diocese was enduring a tremendous financial strain. The Secretariat felt that the Diocesan contribution to the Movement could benefit the Diocese elsewhere. By March 1972, the Secretariat took on two items that proved most significant. First, Bill Roll (M #12), Diocesan Lay Director, notified the Diocese that Cursillo would no longer require financial support which had been given to the Movement under Catholic Charities.

Second, was the decision to tithe all money that the Movement received in the future "with the complete faith that God would provide for all our needs. Initially we would be sending 5% of our gross income to the Diocese, 3% to the National Cursillo Office, and 2% to the Regional Cursillo Office". Previously, articles had been written in the newsletter on "Tithing" and Christian Stewardship" on a personal level. Bill Rae, Paul Needham and Frank Krahling (M #15) were extremely key in these efforts. "Buffalo Cursillo Newsletters", March 1972 and October 1972.

Already, by late 1972, having held over 60 and Spanish Weekends, new cots, tables and chairs needed to be purchased. In Nov. 1972, the Secretariat began a Faith Pledge program to assist the financial needs of the Movement. Pledge cards and pre-addressed envelopes were enclosed in the monthly newsletters. Cursillistas were asked to fill out what they could give for a 12-month period. Signatures were optional. Pledge cards would be returned by mail (with the returnee's stamp) or placed in the "Red Box" marked "HELP" at subsequent diocesan Reunion Masses. The Secretariat could then estimate in some measure how much they could afford for replacement equipment. In his August 1973 article, Paul Needham reported that they received a total of \$13,192 in

pledges, in almost a year (ranging from \$1 a month to \$500 a year) enabling the Secretariat to purchase needed tables, chairs and office equipment and to increase the number of Cursillos offered.

When Jim Honer took over as Treasurer, in 1974, a faith pledge card was printed periodically in the newsletter which Cursillistas could cut out and mail to the Cursillo Post Office Box or drop in the box at the monthly Reunion Mass.

In an article in the "Buffalo Cursillo Newsletter", March, 1975 (P 2) Ralph Roll (M #11), Lay Director, reiterated the Secretariat's financial policy of being self-sufficient and to tithe 10% of their gross income—"giving it back to Christ". New cots still needed to be purchased and there were only 10 pledge cards returned by March 1975. As prices continued to rise, Ralph asked Cursillistas to contribute \$2 for their annual newsletter and to make a faith pledge and to honor it.

Jim Walsh, (M #27) Lay Director, noted in his article on "Stewardship" in the October 1976 "Buffalo Cursillo Newsletter" that in 1973 and 1974, tithes were paid, and "financially we struggled through increased expenses and needs. The years 1975 and 1976 were challenging and tithes from the Movement were not able to be met."

My lack of Secretariat minutes from 1974 to 1993, and the Secretariat's refusal to discuss "putting a price on making the Weekend left the financial situation in the Weekend" left the financial situation in the Hands of God and to the generosity of present and future Cursillistas.

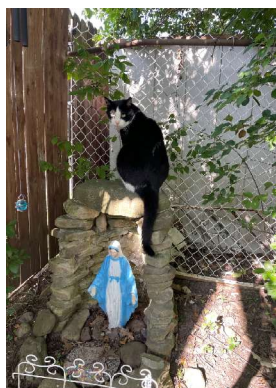
