Lay Director's Report

Certainly, we need to continue praying rosaries and making sacrifices as palanca to support the newest Cursillistas, women and men, but also as we look forward to our Spring weekends that will be here before we know and start to discern who the Lord is calling us to befriend.

The Region III Fall Encounter was recently held at Stella Niagara Center for Renewal and attended by Regional coordinators and team members, secretariats from Rochester, Buffalo, Cleveland, Pittsburg, Youngstown and Altoona-Johnstown. The attendees included approximately 25 people in person and another five or six via zoom. The conference center was quite comfortable and picturesque. After some regional business, we heard talks on The Precursillo and Leadership. The Precursillo talks focused on some of the hows and whys of precursillo. For example, it bears repeating that we always need to talk to God about our friends before we talk to our friends about God. Also, we need to know that it is God who chooses, not us. And Cursillo is not a place for us to "fix" our

friends, family members or fellow employees. But it does give us the place to naturally and authentically live our faith in the world. The main ideas covered in the Leadership talks included reminders for us all to take leadership, not ownership, be inclusive and not divisive and to try to discover what are our greatest obstacles to unity. The encounter began on Friday night and ended with Mass celebrated by Fr. Mickey McGrath on Saturday afternoon. Historian Report:

Buffalo Cursillo History #11 (continued):

November 2022 “The Secretariat at Work”

“The Secretariat is a special committee whose members – priests, religious and lay people – are selected from the Cursillo community and commissioned by the Church hierarchy to direct, coordinate, inspire and serve the Movement at the diocesan or national level...so that the Movement can be effectively integrated into the life and pastoral activities of the Church.”

The Fundamental Ideas of the Cursillo Movement #576 (1992)

The lay director is responsible for the organizational and executive domains. The spiritual advisor, always a priest, religious or deacon is responsible for matters concerning doctrine and conscience.

“A typical secretariat consists of the lay director; the spiritual advisor; the chair-persons of the School of Leaders, Precursillo, Cursillo and Postcursillo sections, a secretary and treasurer”.

Leaders' Manual p.42 (1988) & p.68 (2006)

These men and women are usually members of the School of Leaders who pray and have a group reunion before the Secretariat meeting.

The Buffalo Cursillo Lay Director leadership passed to Dick O'Donnell (Men's #5) from 1968 to 1970 and to Bill Rae (Men's #12) from 1971 to 1973. Fr. Barry Smith (Erie #6) was the Spiritual Director for Buffalo from 1969 to 1973 when he took over directorship of the House of Prayer at St. John Vianney Seminary (later renamed Christ the King Seminary).

In 1970, the Diocesan Cursillo Lay Director was invited to be a member of the newly formed Diocesan Pastoral Council.

Before there were standard missalettes and hymn books in the pews, people brought their own missals and prayer books to Mass.

Some parishes provided the Cantate Omnes, a small collection of hymns for congregational use compiled and published by the Catholic Choirmasters' Guild of Buffalo. The Buffalo Secretariat proceeded to publish its own song book, "Pilgrim's Guide" and "Leaders' School Manual."

The Cursillo Liturgy Committee, (one of several additional Committees on Buffalo's Secretariat) Sr. Mary Ann Martin, SSJ (Women's #5) and Jerry Stone (Men's #13) chose many new songs, folk and modern (post Vatican II) as well as traditional hymns for the Cursillo song book. They also had to obtain publishing rights.

Several songs composed by seminarian Paul Kowalewski (Men's #20) were added to the book. Volunteer Mary Ann Szafran typed and assembled music books for the guitarists.

Fr. Walter Kern (Men's #14) created and had printed locally the first "Pilgrim's Guide", for Buffalo. Copies of the Pilgrims' Guide" are usually distributed to the candidates after the 1st talk on Thursday evenings and used for morning and evening prayer as well as other spiritual exercises during the weekend. Previously, prayer and song sheets were used.

Max Knorr (Men's #9) put together a Leaders' School Manual and each year prepared a Curriculum for Leaders' School assisted by George Sentz (Men's #16) and Len Stauffer (Men's #8). Leaders' School is meant to be one of spirituality, formation and Christian community. The main topics included some of the Documents of Vatican II particularly "Apostolate of the Laity" and the "Church in the Modern World." Other topics to promote spiritual growth in the Fourth Day included Permanent Groups and Spiritual Direction. Early Leaders' School could also be called Catholic adult education and was attended by scores of Cursillistas.

For the first 10 years, the good will white envelope offerings on the weekends averaged about \$15 per person. The diocese contributed \$4,000 to the Secretariat annually. Because there were fees to the National Cursillo Office, printing and postage for about 1000 Buffalo Cursillo Newsletters, the Treasurer, Paul Needham (Men's #9) suggested taking up a collection at the Diocesan Reunion and Cursillo closing Masses. Annual pledge cards brought in a substantial amount.

In the 1960's, there were very few books available in English on the Cursillo Movement. These included The Leaders' Manual (1964), and Questions and Problems and The Pastoral Letter by Bishop Juan Hervas; Lower your Nets and the Group Reunion by Fr. Juan Capo; also, The Structure of Ideas and an article "The How and the Why" by Eduardo Bonnin.

At the first meeting of the National Secretariat of the Cursillo movement in 1966 in Kansas City (the group moved several places until establishing the Office of the National Secretariat in Dallas, Texas), the commentaries on the outlines for the Cursillo talks were commissioned. The commentaries clarified the goal of the movement, what should be included in the rollos (talks) and how they should be given.

“The Commentary on the Outlines of the Talks”, which synthesized the above publications was prepared for an American audience by Stephen Clark and Ralph Martin (later noted Catholic authors in their own right). The copies were available to the diocesan Secretariats in manuscript form to be used by the Rectors and the Professors giving the rollos.

In 1970, the Second World Encounter was held in Mexico City, Mexico. Pope Paul VI sent a message to be read to Cursillistas in attendance which was also the Second World Ultreya. It was here that the 1st International Group was formed (OLCC) Latin American Group. Our Lady of Guadalupe was invoked as the Patroness of Cursillo.

The year before, December 14, 1969, Pope Paul VI had approved St. Paul as Patron of Cursillo.
