Lay Coordinator Report:

Let's talk baseball. Spring training is over, and the regular season is underway. Every team wants to win the World's Series. Some may have a better chance than others, but everyone has the same goal: win the BIG ONE. That's why they all went into training and worked hard to make the team. They exercised, they practiced, they played. Every player knows that if they want to succeed, they are going to have to continue to work hard all season and not let occasional setbacks divert them from their goal.

Now let's talk Cursillo. Spring training (Lent) is over, and the Easter season is underway. Our goal is much higher than the World Series. We have a Supergoal to win: Heaven for ourselves, our loved ones, and our friends. How was your spring training? Did you make it to as many ultreyas as possible? Did you go to confession regularly? Did you attend daily Mass if your life circumstances allow? Did you get into the daily habit of praying a rosary, a Divine Mercy chaplet, or a novena? Did you attend or join a permanent group as often as possible? Did you make a friend? Did you talk to the Lord about your friend? Did you fast, even in a small way? What are your expectations for the coming season?

St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians and said, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Well, I do not run aimlessly, I do not box as one beating the air; but I pommel my body and subdue it, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified." (1 Cor. 9:24-26)

To that I say, Amen Paul. It's no wonder you're a saint. I want to be on your team.

Corinth in the time of St. Paul was a lot like the United States is today: prosperous, and decadent. On April 8th there was a total solar eclipse of the sun which should have been visible in Buffalo, but it was cloudy. No matter. Millions of people gazed to the heavens to witness an awesome act of God's glory. Coincidentally, April 8th was also the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord this year. It's *usually* on March 25th. Coincidence? I think not. I do find it exceedingly interesting that a partial to total eclipse covered almost all North and Central America, cutting right through the heart of the United States. Not Europe. Not Asia. Not China, Russia or anyplace else on Earth. I see it as a call to conversion that starts with each of us. Pray for the conversion of this country. Pray for souls that have turned away from God. Pray for lukewarm souls. Stay awake and pray. Now that spring training is over, let us not coast through the season.

Happy Easter! Jesus Christ is risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!!! Death, darkness, and sin no longer prevail. Recognizing and participating in this joy requires only that we believe in Jesus Christ and live as he taught. The more of us that do exactly that, the more the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth grows and the greater the number of people who will enjoy eternal life in heaven one day.

Our readings at Mass, especially this time of year, inspire us to bring Christ to others - to let people know where to find him and let them know why they want to know him. Sometimes we can think that proclaiming the Gospel message is something to be taken care of by others, clergy, for instance. But, think about it: in Mark's Gospel, on the way back from the empty tomb, who is it that Jesus tells to go and proclaim to others that he has risen? Historian's Report

Buffalo Cursillo History (Addendum to February 2024 #25)

Buffalo Cursillo History, #27 Cursillo, Ecumenism and Koinonia- Part I

Before discussing the Protestant Cursillo Movement Koinonia, it's important to acknowledge some religious and cultural factors. In the first half of the 20th Century, American Catholics grew up with a few admonitions and myths; some fostered by the European Catholic Church. For example, only the clergy could read and interpret the Bible. Lay Catholics were forbidden to read the Bible, except for the Epistle and Gospel in their Latin and English Sunday Missal.

In Spain, it wasn't until 1958 that women were allowed to make a Cursillo because "priests said that women were incapable of making a group reunion." **Eduardo Bonnin Aquilo, 100 Years Biography-Mentality**, 2017 4 (P. 70)

In America, older generations categorized people by nationality or religion, probably stemming from the bigotry against Catholics in the 19th Century. Catholics were discouraged from going into a Protestant Church or associating with Protestants. Many Catholics held these prejudices from childhood regarding the Bible and Protestants. (Nevertheless, those Protestant relatives and friends in this writer's youth were loving and generous. It was never a matter of religion).

It's all the more important to know how significant Christian unity was to Pope Paul VI in wanting to reach out to other churches. To cite the Vatican II "Decree on Ecumenism" published in 1964: "The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the second Vatican Council." The Sixteen Documents of Vatican II, "Decree on Ecumenism" #1.

Christ prayed at the Last Supper to His Father for all who believe in Him "that they all may be one." (John 17:21). Christ the Lord founded the one and only Church of God. Even from the beginning of the Church, there arose certain rifts which the Apostles readily condemned. Through the centuries much more serious divisions arose and "large communities came to be separated from full communion with the Catholic Church-for which often enough, men of both sides were to blame." Catechism of the Catholic Church #817

Many Christian Churches believe themselves to be true inheritors of Jesus Christ; all indeed profess to be followers of the Lord. Some Christian Churches have validly consecrated bishops and sacraments. Other groups do not have apostolic succession, valid Orders or sacraments. The difference in doctrine and discipline "create many obstacles, sometimes serious ones, to preclude them from full ecclesiastical communion." "Decree on Ecumenism #3"

"Catholics and many among our separated brethren have been moved by the grace of the Holy Spirit for restoration of unity among all Christians. The movement toward unity is called 'ecumenical.'" "Decree on Ecumenism" #1.

The "ecumenical movement" strove to overcome some of the obstacles. It did not pretend to solve all the ecumenical problems or accept each other's doctrines. "Nevertheless, it remained true that all who have been justified by faith in Baptism are members of Christ's body, and have the right to be called Christians, and so we are correctly accepted as brothers (and sisters) by the children of the Catholic Church." "Decree on Ecumenism #3."

Because of their baptism, Christians share significant elements contributing to their salvation: the Sacred Scriptures, the life of grace; faith, hope and charity with the other interior gifts of the Holy Spirit. Pope Paul VI urged all faithful Catholics to be eager to implement all the works of ecumenism by prayer, a holy life, mutual knowledge of other faiths, but most important – a thorough knowledge of one's own faith. Catholics were urged to create opportunities for works of charity, of social justice, for dialogue, and prayer-in-common with fellow Christians.

In the late 1960's, the Catholic Church introduced "A Prayer for Christian Unity" to be prayed in January in parishes and religious communities. Catholics and Protestant churches began to dialogue by supplying competent experts to explain the tenets of their faith and rituals. This provided an appreciation of the doctrine and religious life of both communions.

Catholics and Protestants began inviting each other to their churches for shared interfaith services with Bible readings, songs and prayer, especially during Advent and Lent.

These were really giant steps in the ecumenical movement toward Christian unity.

As of this publication, the April Women's Weekend is going forward with seven candidates. There is room for more candidates and still time to submit applications before the April 25 - 28 Weekend. Scroll down the home page of the website to the box that reads, "Applications for Next Weekends."

The upcoming Weekend is blessed to have four members of the Clergy rendering their extraordinary spiritual service as the Weekend Spiritual Advisors. Please pray for them and thank them when you see them: Fr. Ronald Sajak, Deacon Dave Clabeaux, Deacon Mark Bialkowski and Deacon John Hendricks.

We have heard many times that it takes a village to raise a child. The same can be said about running a Cursillo Weekend. Besides the Team, Spiritual Advisors, Team Selectors and Talk Advisors, it takes many people committed to Cursillo to make a Weekend happen. Many of these people serve on the Cursillo Section Committee. In the January and February newsletters we read about the roles of the Team Selectors and Talk Advisors of the Section. In addition to the Selectors and Advisors, the following roles are led by those listed below.

<u>Building Coordinator</u> – Peter Adornetto. The Building Coordinator is responsible for assuring the Weekend facility (St. Vincent de Paul School Building) is set up for the Weekend - - sound systems, partitions, sleeping quarters (beds, mattresses), conference room and chapel area tables and chairs. That the building temperature remains comfortable and any plumbing or lighting concerns are addressed. Making sure the building is returned to its original condition after the Weekend. Many volunteers are needed to assist with these tasks on Wednesday afternoon before the Weekend and Sunday late morning and afternoon of the Weekend. Helpers are always needed.

<u>Kitchen Coordinators</u> – Mike Cucinotta and Otto Misso. The Kitchen Coordinators present eight complete meals from soup to desserts during the Weekend including beverages and snacks, mostly with the assistance from the various Ultreyas and Friendship Group Reunions. When there is a gap in the Ultreya meal preparation schedule, the Kitchen Coordinators themselves produce the meals. They shop for groceries and supplies and make the dining area look inviting and pristine. Volunteers are always welcome.

<u>Palanca Team Coordinator</u> – Diane Reese. The Coordinator and her team perform the tasks that we take for granted. These tasks include setting up and tearing down the building for the needs of the Weekend, praying, praying, praying for the Team Rollo Speakers, organizing and delivering Palanca mail, bathroom cleaning, restoring toilet paper and paper tower supplies, emptying garbage cans, refreshing water pitchers,

mopping up any spillages, providing conference room supplies at the appropriate times, organizing the Community for the Saturday Night Serenade and Sunday Morning Las Mananitas, along with assisting wherever needed, whenever needed. Serving on a Palanca Team is an eye opener into the behind the scenes operation of a Weekend. Offer your assistance for some or all days of the Weekend - - it is genuine Palanca!

<u>Sacristan</u> – Kay Clabeaux. The Sacristan is the person who lays out all the cruets, chalices, ciboria, linens, purificators, hand towels and authorized wine needed for daily private Mass in the Candidates' Chapel during the Weekend.

<u>Liturgist</u> – Jennifer Appenheimer. The Liturgist instructs the Weekend Team Liturgists with suggested music and song, prayers and handouts for the spiritual programs on the Weekend, including the Saturday Night Serenade, Sunday morning Las Mananitas and the Sunday Clausura. The Candidates' Chapel changes are also under the purview of the Liturgist. If you play an instrument, consider becoming a member of the Cursillo Liturgists for Reunion Masses and Opening Night of the Weekend.

<u>Secretary</u> – Julie Cappello. The Secretary attends all Cursillo Section meetings, takes notes and prepares the minutes. The Secretary also places the Weekend schedule and other events on the Building Calendar.

<u>Outgoing Palanca Coordinator</u> - Vacant. This position is responsible for determining the upcoming national and international Weekends and listing the information in the Buffalo Cursillo newsletter. It is a simple "cut and paste" action with the information that appears on the Cursillo National website.

<u>Supplies Coordinator</u> – Vacant. The Coordinator checks on the status of supplies needed prior to every Weekend – envelopes, paper, pens, markers, poster boards, Cursillo Crosses, Pilgrim's Guide Books, etc.

<u>Photographer</u> – Vacant. The Photographer's responsibility is to take a group photo of the Weekend participants (Team and Candidates), usually on Friday morning. The Photographer also needs to produce copies of the photo. Professional camera equipment is not necessary; an iPad has been used for the last few weekends with great success. You need not be a professional photographer for this position.

All those mentioned above require prayer in addition to the Candidates and Team. We all know the importance of Palanca, so let's do it either individually or with your Friendship Group Reunions and Ultreyas. Palanca is the actual prayers, not the notes or gifts. Notes tell the candidates the types of prayers and sacrifices you have done for them - - Rosaries, Masses, Adoration Hours, Fasting, Personal Sacrifices, etc. Think of Palanca as the electricity that comes to our homes, whereas the Palanca note is the electric bill. Come and offer Palanca at the Support Mass - - it will be "electric"!
