Buffalo Cursillo History

Historian's Report #41, November 2025

"The Spanish Cursillo Movement of Buffalo" Part I

The Spanish Cursillo Movement of Buffalo was begun and generated by Fr. Lucio Antonio Rodriguez, who came to Buffalo in 1958 from the diocese of Guadix, Granada, Spain. Born in Leon, Spain on October 11, 1925, Fr. Antonio, as he preferred to be called, was assigned to work in the Diocesan Spanish Apostolate throughout WNY. He first lived at Our Lady of Lebanon Parish in Niagara Falls. From 1960-1965, he served at St. Anthony's Church in Buffalo.

In the early 1960's, Fr. Rodriguez and some men of the Buffalo Inner City Apostolate made their Cursillo in English in Erie, PA. These included Jorge Rodriguez, Marvin Lewis and Richard James.

In 1965, Father was transferred to residence at Immaculate Conception Church on Edward St. to work with the Spanish communities in Buffalo, North Tonawanda, Medina, Dunkirk, and migrant workers in North Collins, Barker and Fredonia for the next fourteen years.

Also in 1965, Father Rodriguez, Fr. Barry Smith and Lou Pauly (who both had also made their Cursillos in Erie, PA) Fr. David Doyle, Thomas Matos, Thomas Rivera, Val Sabol and Mary Bielman, who had made their Cursillos elsewhere, met at St. Nicholas Parish to discuss starting a Cursillo in Buffalo. They were hosted by pastor Fr. Herold Nuwer, also a Cursillista. Fr. Rodriguez, Fr. Dave Doyle, and Thomas Rivera were intent on beginning a Spanish Cursillo Movement in WNY as there was a large Catholic Puerto Rican and Mexican population. Many living in Lackawanna and Buffalo were under contract to Bethlehem Steel; many worked for the railroads.

Hispanic leaders were recruited to make their Cursillo in Spanish in New York City. They returned on fire with the love for Jesus Christ and for the Movement. This ignited the flame for the Buffalo Spanish speaking Catholic community. Hundreds of people signed up to experience Cursillo. Photos of early Buffalo Spanish Cursillos reveal over fifty men on a weekend. Another picture shows seventy-two Hispanic women posing for their Cursillo photo.

Visiting priests from South America and Columbia, who came to Buffalo for vacation participated in organizing these Cursillo Weekends. Other priests from Mexico and Puerto Rico were also active in the Spanish Cursillo while they visited this diocese.

Early on, the English and Spanish Cursillos shared equipment and the same spaces such as St Mary's Redemptorist Church, St. Mary's Business School, on Broadway, St. Mary's High School in Lancaster, Brothers of Mercy and Bishop Gibbons High School, and Our Lady of Lebanon. They always partnered with Buffalo English Cursillistas when attending Regional Cursillo meetings and National Encounters.

According to a recent interview with Deacon Miguel Santos, almost all the Spanish Community leaders became Cursillistas, and all of the Spanish church leaders came from the Cursillo movement. Early lay leaders of the Buffalo Spanish Ultreya were Carlos Ramos in the early

1980's and Miguel Santos in the late 1980's, and Roberto Miranda, a highly regarded Cursillista, all who later became deacons to serve the Buffalo Diocese.

The Spanish Ultreya was very active in the late 1960's, 1970's, and 1980's. The Ultreya rotated meeting at St. Anthony's, Holy Cross, St. Columba-Brigid's, St. Valentine's and at churches in North Tonawanda and Dunkirk. The Spanish Ultreya waned in the 1980's, but got a second wind in the late 1990's. One reason for the decline was the closure of Bethlehem Steel Plant in October 1983 laying off 7,000 workers.

Fr. Anthony Rodriguez was a member of Hispanic United Buffalo, Inc. and was selected Hispanic of the Year in 2009. Fr. Rodriguez retired in 2003 to live at Bishop Head Residence in Lackawanna, NY. He entered into his eternal rest on January 14, 2021.

The Buffalo Diocese and especially the Hispanic Community and Cursillistas are greatly indebted to Fr. Rodriguez for his many years of untiring and far- reaching ministry in bringing souls to Christ.

- 1. Volunteer to DO something. DON'T wait to be asked.
- 2. DON'T rely on others to get the work done. You can DO something.
- 3. "What can I DO?"
 - It takes many hands to convert the building into a retreat center.
 - Wednesday before the Weekend, set up: the Chapel, Conference Room, Shower Areas, Sleeping Areas for the Team, Candidates, Palanca Team and Deacons.
 - Sunday as the Weekend concludes, tear down of all areas from Wednesday.

- 4. If you DON'T have time to help on Wednesday or Sunday, DO consider other times on the Weekend such as:

- 7. If you are donating books to the Book Table, DO make sure they are in good condition. No text books, no books with handwritten notes, highlighting or personal notes left in the books. DON'T donate books that are not of Catholic doctrine; check the opening pages and names of the publishers. DON'T donate plaques, framed pictures, etc. This is a "Book Table"; storing items not taken during the Weekend is becoming burdensome.
- 8. DO be part of every Weekend in any way that you can. We are a Community and should support every Weekend Team and all Candidates. "CHRIST IS COUNTING ON YOU."

It's amazing how busy a person can become with parish or faith related things. Cursillo has opened my world up to just such a busy-ness. The satisfaction that comes with being involved in my church community and our cursillo community is second to none. I've watched others who have come through a Cursillo weekend or some other encounter and gone on to become more involved in their parish life. It's wonderful to see.

With all of this busy-ness can come a price though. We can find ourselves feeling a bit overwhelmed, or we can see all of this activity getting in the way of family life. Discouragement can creep in if something we are involved in doesn't go so well.

Staying in touch with God through prayer is a key to ensuring we don't feel overwhelmed or get discouraged or miss out on important family events. The Holy Spirit guides us on our faith journey and when we rely on him through prayer, our priorities, our next steps, our path will be made clear.
